GUIDELINES

Focus Session Information Each Focus session lasts 90 minutes. Speakers jointly occupy 60 minutes of the allotted time for each focus session, leaving 20 - 30 minutes for questions/discussion depending on the topic. Sessions may include a single presenter, co-presenters or a small panel. Speakers should make the sessions as interactive as possible to include audience participation through discussion or activity. Session rooms are set in banquet rounds. An LCD projector, screen and laptop (PC/Windows/MS Office) are provided in each session room. Additional audio visual equipment is the responsibility of each presenter.

Maritime Heritage Papers Individual papers, (no to exceed) 20 minutes in length, (three or four papers in each 90 minute session), may address a specific subject or aspects of the broader themes of the conference.

Presentation Application Process Please submit a 250 word (or less) abstract (overview) of your presentation idea that includes your objectives, the intended audience, and the “take-away” value for the audience. Abstracts should clearly outline the paper’s main points, its place within the broader themes in maritime history. Your submission must include the following:

1. A working title
2. A brief one-paragraph vita (biography) for each presenter.
3. A digital photograph of each presenter (*to be published in the conference program and on the conference blog*).
4. A concise paragraph of 150 words or less describing your proposed session, *to be printed in the conference program and posted on the conference blog*. (The steering committee reserves the right to edit submissions.)
5. The format you envision (panel, individual presenter, co-presenters or interactive workshop)
6. Your name, contact information (email and phone number) and that of any co-presenters as well as, the umbrella organization to which the presenter belongs (if applicable).
7. Any special requests regarding room set-up.
8. Any audio visual requirements in addition to the standard room set-up mentioned above.

Deadlines and Selection Process The deadline for submitting proposals is November 1, 2017. The proposals will be reviewed by the Conference Steering Committee and you will be notified of a decision no later than November 15, 2017. The committee is looking for focus sessions that are substantive, innovative and interactive and relate to one or more of the topics listed above.

Where applicable, all presenters will be required to provide an electronic copy of their session. These will be posted on the Conference website following the conference. **Please, no overt promotion of a specific company or product.** If you will use handouts (recommended), plan on supplying at least 100 copies.

Presenter Policy While we appreciate the valuable contributions that mariners, historians, educators and administrators make by speaking at this conference, speakers serve as volunteers and do not receive compensation. All travel, lodging, meals, or other expenses associated with the conference are the responsibility of the individual presenter. **Presenters are expected to register and pay for the conference**, but may be considered for a reduced registration fee. This fee reduction does not apply to large panel participants.
